Black college students are NOT apathetic when it comes to politics and civic engagement. Instead, they are sometimes disengaged from related public discourse because they do not find their viewpoints invited, heard or their voices encouraged. Inaccurate assumptions that Black college students share monolithic viewpoints or mainly align with a singular political party's policies, necessitates an unbiased platform through which their voices can be heard.

Featuring Black students from a variety of HBCUs and Non-HBCUs as the panelists of crowd-sourced national issues that influence their vote; and elected officials, civic organization leaders and fellow students as the audience, this is a different model of engagement.

GenerationNext: Thought Leaders summit presented by <u>I Love My HBCU? LLC</u> provides:
